During July 2022, LEAPS was airborne 94.2 hours and dispatched 138 times for 25.5 hours of airborne tactical support and 68.7 hours of strategic surveillance with real-time visible and infrared (IR) imagery within the Lancaster and surrounding unincorporated areas in the Antelope Valley Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD) area of responsibility.

Dispatch results for July fall into distinct categories summarized to the right on this page. Dispatches from the Lancaster LASD station covered an area generally defined by Avenue B to the North, 170th Street on the East, Avenue N on the South and 70th Street to the West; encompassing over 264 square miles. Some specific events during windy and intermittent precipitation conditions include the following:

July's dispatches had LEAPS supporting and responding to a reported call for backup concerning a group of multiple individuals being uncooperative with those on the scene. LEAPS circled and provided video coverage.



LEAPS responded to a pawnshop burglary call stating a suspect left in a white van. Shortly another call came in reporting a white van "reckless driver" near Avenue H and 10th Street west. Spotting the van LEAPS started tracking. Deputy pursuit began and a felony stop was initiated. After a few minutes, the suspect took off and pursuit continued. The van stopped again and the suspect ran into the desert. Deputies caught the suspect and detained him.

LEAPS arrived first and provided aerial coverage for Deputies, Los Angeles Fire and Paramedics for a multiple vehicle accident until the event was closed and the site reopened.


